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

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### **Current Situation**

- Over 900 Heavy vehicles nationwide
- Use approx. 20M litres of diesel per annum
- There is a significant opportunity to make fuel efficiency gains
- Behavioural change





### **Projected Benefits**

#### **Improved Safety**

• Safe driving and fuel efficient driving are essentially the same. Both require drivers to observe and anticipate the situation ahead, manage speed and maintain vehicles in good condition.

#### Reduced R&M

• Improved driving techniques should result in less repairs and maintenance costs across the fleet.

#### **Improved Profit**

Fuel savings achieved across all Group fleets. <u>As a group our target is 10%</u>

#### **Improved Compliance**

• Can result in an improved ORS score.

#### **Reduced Emissions**

• Improved fuel efficiency helps reduce the company's carbon footprint.



### **Progress to date**

- 17 Companies in the programme to date (Transport & Petroleum)
- Trained Fuel Management Advisors
- Qualified SAFED trainers
- Run Fuel Management Workshops
- Documented Fuel Management Action Plans
- Fuel Efficiency Working Groups operating in each company
- SAFED training underway





### **Outcomes to date**

- Engaged management group
- Baseline fuel figures for each fleet
- Southern Logging saving 7% on fuel spend
- **SAFED** Training
  - Individual fuel savings of 5 16%
  - Reductions in gear changes of 30 – 53%
  - Reduction in trip times
- Safer drivers on the road GAME CHANGING TRANSPORT
